Travel Advisory - Covid19

Dear Valued Travelers,

We understand many of you have concerns with the Coronavirus. Please be assured Chamber Discoveries and the entire travel industry is taking this issue very seriously and proactively working to ensure your safety. We want you to know Chamber Discoveries is here to keep you updated on the current measures being taken. We are in touch with our travel partners daily. We are also monitoring the situation through the Department of State, CDC, and WHO.

Please keep in mind; we have not cancelled any of our trips at this time. Should we determine the need to cancel a specific itinerary, we will contact travelers affected by that decision directly. If you choose to cancel the trip based on your concerns, we encourage you to contact the Travel Insurance provider (Travelex Insurance (800) 228-9792) and your program operations manager to review your options before finalizing your plans.

Coronavirus: What you need to know

The situation is very fluid and may change at a moment's notice, however unprecedented precautions have been implemented by the airlines, cruise lines, and local communities in some areas regarding the Coronavirus crisis including screening for anyone (guests or staff members) who have traveled from, visited or transited impacted countries. Additional cleaning, disinfection and rigorous sanitizations are also taking place.

When traveling abroad it is best practice to enroll in the U.S. State Department's free Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP) which provides important information from the Embassy about safety conditions in the destination country while also helping the U.S. Embassy to contact citizens in an emergency.

Chamber Discoveries would like to remind you, the simplest and most effective way to prevent illness, is to take extra care to practice basic health habits while traveling, including:

- Washing your hands frequently for at least 20 seconds
- Taking advantage of hand sanitizer wherever it's available
- Covering your nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing using a tissue or your bent elbow. And always dispose of the used tissue and wash your hands afterwards
- Avoiding touching your eyes, nose and mouth with your hands
